The Center for Public Representation will defend the civil rights of people with disabilities, people of color, and low-income people whose lives and livelihoods will be jeopardized if the incoming administration cuts Medicaid, weakens the Affordable Care Act, or implements policies that restrict access to services and healthcare—their lifelines to community living. And we will staunchly oppose efforts that increase reliance on segregated institutions, that deprive people of agency and choice, that criminalize mental illness, and that promote negative stereotypes of people with disabilities.

Mindful of lessons learned during the first Trump administration, CPR is galvanizing its partners across the nation in the healthcare, disability, legal, and social justice communities to counter any attempt to reduce the critical support services that people with disabilities need to live full and productive lives in the community.
